We now know the name of the man who was killed at the Quakertown Farmers Market in

Bucks County Saturday afternoon. Market officials say **Earl Yerkes, 85, was electrocuted on the roof** sometime around 2:00. They say he was working on an air-conditioning unit, when the electrical disconnect shorted out. Yerkes was the assistant operations manager and had worked at the market for nearly 50 years. He also helped run a family restaurant, the Souper-Bowl, inside the market.
